
IdahoCAFE Center for Agriculture, Food and the Environment

The Idaho Center for Agriculture, Food and the Environment (CAFE) will be the country's largest and most advanced research center targeting the dairy and allied industries. The dairy will have a herd size of 2,000 animals and will be located in the heart of the state's dairy producing region. While research data generated at CAFE will have broad implications across the U.S., the semi-arid environment where most of Idaho's dairies are located will make CAFE's research indispensable in the water-constrained West.



- Contributing to U of I's goal to achieve R1 status




A REGIONAL MODEL

Oct 2019: Release of \$10M from the permanent building fund kicked off a record year of progress for CAFE

Oct 2019: Research began at the research dairy site (Rupert); soil sampling to establish baseline data for

future environmental research

Jan 2020: Dairyman John W. Wright hired as project manager

Apr 2020: Selection of firms to design and build the research dairy; Boise-based McAlvain Construction and

design firm Keller and Associates with offices in several Idaho cities

May 2020: Received USDA NIFA grant for \$10M to fund CAFE work that will establish a new bioeconomy for

the dairy industry

Jun 2020: \$200k investment from Anheuser-Busch Foundation to support agronomic research at

the research dairy site, additional \$200k investment in 2021

Jul 2021: Selection of milking system – DeLaval rotary milking parlor

Apr 2022: Construction to begin at Rupert dairy site

Summer 2023: Cows onsite and milking begins at Rupert dairy site
